


# **World Book Day**

Let's have a magical day on 7th March!



# Advice for Parents & Carers

### KEEP TALKING

Chat to your child about the content they consume on social media and the influencers that they like. Encourage them to think critically about what they see and hear online, and listen to any concerns they might have. Maintaining this line of open, honest communication can help your child to make informed decisions a which individuals they follow and what content they engage with.

#### SET SOME BOUNDARIES
