Homework

The focus this year will be on **Reading** and **Arithmetic** (eg. times tables/number bonds etc.). Arithmetic based practice will be given on a Friday and must be signed in your Maths Passport Book and handed in by the following Thursday.

Daily learning and practice is important. Remember to use lots of different ways to learn your times tables like our 'Keep Fit X Tables', counting in jumps forward and backwards, using songs, finding missing numbers and multiplication squares. Times tables practice will also be set on **Times Tables Rock Stars** each week.

A topic-based piece of homework will be set each term to link with our learning in class. You will have several weeks to complete this activity. More information about this will sent home soon.

<u>Reading books and Reading Record Books</u> must be brought to school every day and signed at least five times a week to build a routine of regular home reading.

Also, please feel free to note any other extra reading that you do! We love to hear all about the fantastic reading you are doing at home!
